While their offices are located in the cities listed, many serve a large region surrounding their office. Also, some immigration cases don't require court appearances, so they can be handled remotely. If you don't live in any of the cities listed, please contact the organization nearest to you to inquire about pro bono opportunities in your area or cases that can be handled remotely.

[\*\*American Gateways\*\*](#) (Austin, San Antonio) – Provides a range of immigration representation to low-income persons seeking assistance in Central Texas.

[\*\*Boat People SOS, Inc.\*\*](#) (Houston) – Provides civil legal assistance for low-income Vietnamese Texans in the areas of domestic violence, human trafficking, family law, immigration and wills.

[\*\*Cabrini Center For Immigration Legal Services\*\*](#) (Houston) – Provides civil legal services to low-income immigrants who are seeking assistance with asylum and residency issues in Harris County.

[\*\*Kids in Need of Defense \(KIND\)\*\*](#) (Houston) – Provides pro bono legal immigration services for unaccompanied children released to the Houston area.

**Las Americas** (El Paso) – Provides legal representation for indigent refugees, immigrants and unaccompanied minors, in matters such as asylum, domestic violence against immigrants, and wage recovery for low-income workers.

**Mosaic Family Services** (Dallas) – Provides comprehensive social services for immigrants and refugees and legal representation in both immigration and family law to immigrant survivors of crime, such a domestic violence and human trafficking.

**South Texas Pro Bono Asylum Representation Project (ProBAR)** (Harlingen) –Provides legal services in immigration proceedings to detained, indigent immigrants and asylum-seekers, through direct service and pro bono representation; Children’s Project serves detained, unaccompanied children at shelters in South Texas by providing them with “Know Your Rights” presentations and coordinating their legal representation.

**Refugee and Immigrant Center for Education and Legal Services (RAICES)** (Austin, Corpus Christi, Dallas/Fort Worth, and San Antonio) – Provides immigration-related legal services for asylum seekers, unaccompanied minors, immigrant detainees, and victims of domestic violence, crime, and human trafficking.

**Tahirih Justice Center** (Houston) – Provides pro bono legal services in immigration and family law, as well as holistic case management support, social and medical service referrals.
